



# Estonian Junior Challenge 2025 guide Confirmed 04.01.2025

Estonian Junior Challenge (formerly Estonian R2 Challenge) is a series for young rally drivers launched by the Estonian Autosport Union (EASU) at the beginning of 2017. All the rounds of the challenge are driven within the Estonian Rally Championship (ERC). The aim of the series is to help the best young talents to step forward in their careers and to give support for stepping up to international level.

Estonian Junior Challenge 2025 partner is M-Sport Poland.

In 2025, the prize for the Estonian Junior Challenge (EJC) is a scholarship designated for participation in the European Rally Championship 2026 within the ERC4 Junior category, utilizing a Rally4 car provided by M-Sport Poland.

The total cost of the project is 123 600  $\in$ , covering car rental, event entry fees, fuel and tires for six events.

The prize value is **48 000** €, and it will be distributed among the top three drivers as follows:

- Winner of EJC 2025 will be able to drive three (3) ERC rounds with following cost:
  a. Total cost of one (1) event is 20 600 €, which will be covered as follows:
  - i. EASU support of 4000 € including VAT (based on an invoice), what will be paid out after each ERC event the driver has started.
  - ii. M-Sport Poland discount from each event overall price is **4000** €, what will be deducted from event price.
  - iii. EJC winners co-financing 12 600 €.
  - b. The winner of EJC 2025 will select the events he or she wishes to participate in after the FIA has released the ERC calendar for the 2026 season.
- 2) Second in EJC 2025 will be able to drive two (2) ERC rounds with following cost:
  - a. Total cost of one (1) event is 20 600  $\in$ . which will be covered as follows:
    - i. EASU support of **4000** € including VAT (based on an invoice), what will be paid out after each ERC event the driver has started.
    - ii. M-Sport Poland discount from each event overall price is 4000 €, what will be deducted from event price.
    - iii. EJC winners co-financing 12 600 €.
  - b. The second-place finisher in EJC 2025 will select the events he or she wishes to participate in after the FIA has released the ERC calendar for the 2026 season and following the selection of events by the winner of EJC 2025.
- 3) Third in EJC 2025 will be able to drive one (1) ERC round with following cost:
  - a. Total cost of one (1) event is 20 600  $\in$ . which will be covered as follows:
    - i. EASU support of 4000 € including VAT (based on an invoice), what will be paid out after each ERC event the driver has started.
    - ii. M-Sport Poland discount from each event overall price is 4000 €, what will be deducted from event price.
    - iii. EJC winners co-financing **12** 600 €.
  - b. The third-place finisher in EJC 2025 will choose the events he or she want to participate in after the FIA has released the ERC calendar for the 2026 season and following the selection of events by the winner and the second-place finisher in the EJC 2025 classification.

- The prize does not include following costs: travel, accommodation, recce costs for crews, rally car livery, competitors' personal safety equipment, insurance excess, personal accident insurance and testing.
- Should the winner not be able to join the program, the scholarship will be granted to the next driver down of the EJC 2025 classification, etc.
- Event selection must be done latest 2 months before first European Rally Championship will take place.
- All payment and agreement terms will be individually negotiated with each winner.

## To qualify for the EJC in 2025 the following criteria are mandatory:

- The date of birth of the 1<sup>st</sup> driver must be 1 January 1999 or later (26 years or younger). The age of the co-driver is not defined but the co-driver is never allowed to drive the special stage. All drivers holding a valid driver's license and a valid competition license issued by the EASU or another ASN may participate. Championship registration fee is 100 € https://broneerimine.autosport.ee/estonian-junior-challenge/
- 2) The competition car is a defined technical specifications of Ford Fiesta R2 or Ford Fiesta Rally4 of homologations: A-5729, A-5762 and A-5775.
- 3) Tyres used for the series are a defined specification of Pirelli tyres with the following dimensions and prices:

Snow & ice: Pirelli 185/65-15 WJ/ WJA / WJB / WJC 7mm - 340,00 € (excluding VAT) Gravel: Pirelli 185/70-15 SCORPION K6 - 210,00 € (excluding VAT)

## Tyres are supplied by Black & Round SIA and OT Racing OÜ

- 4) M-Sport Poland to have branding on front and rear windshield.
- 5) Pirelli to have branding on 4 x Bumper Corners.
- 6) By entering to series participants acknowledge that EASU has the right to use them with racing cars for promotional events 2 x 8 hours during the season 2024.

### **Classification and calendar**

- 1) EJC drivers will score points according to Estonian Rally Championship Regulations art. 4.1
- 2) In EJC classifications each stage win will give one extra point. In case of retirement driver will keep the stage win points unless if he or she was NOT disqualified for the infringement of technical regulations or unsporting behaviour.
- 3) No Power Stage points will be given in the EJC classification.
- 4) Double points are rewarded in EJC classification on the last Estonian Championship event (Saaremaa rally). 1<sup>st</sup> place 60 points, 2<sup>nd</sup> place 48 points, 3<sup>rd</sup> place 42 points, 4<sup>th</sup> place 38 points, 5<sup>th</sup> place 34 points etc.
- 5) EJC 2024 winner will be driver who has scored the highest number of points. In case of a tie, the driver with most wins, most second places, most third places etc. will be winner. Should this not be enough to decide the Challenge winner, the results of events, where both drivers competed, will decide. Should this not be enough to decide the Championship, results of the last, the penultimate etc. event will decide.
- 6) Five (5) best results out of six (6) rallies will count for win.
